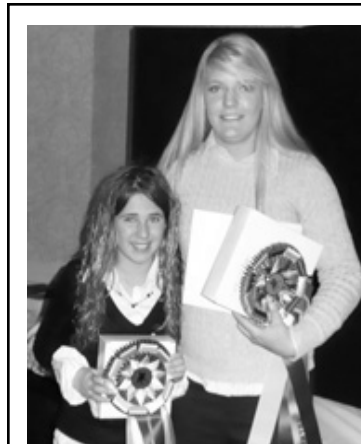

Prize Money Continues to Grow for Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) has announced that the 2008 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships will award prize money of over \$146,000 divided among the nine regions. Champions will each receive \$314 in prize money, a jacket, and an embroidered cooler provided by Tuff Rider, Inc.

Reserve champions will each receive \$210 in prize money and a lead shank from the Great American Insurance Group, title sponsor of the championships.

Every year Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships are held in each of the nine USDF regions. As a direct result of the support of this program by the Great

American Insurance Group, these championships have continued to flourish and grow. Competitors around the country compete in United States Equestrian Federation-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions throughout the competition season to qualify to compete in these championships.

The USDF Spring Executive Board meeting was held at the USDF National Education Center at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington on April 18-19. One of the hot topics was the revised USEF Dressage Committee proposed performance standards.

However, the majority of our discussions focused on the implementation of the strategic plan. One ad hoc committee analyzed all 30 of USDF's educational program and will recommend program improvements and reallocation of resources. The National Championships committee developed preliminary recommendations to hold championships for adult amateurs from Training Level through Grand Prix and for open riders from Training through Fourth Level. The championships may be held as early as the Fall of 2011. We also started the most challenging aspect of the strategic plan, which is to evaluate our governance structure and process. More detail will be discussed at our next convention in Denver.

Kyra Kyrklund will conduct the USDF Symposium in Denver December 6-7. I attended her symposium in Scottsdale several years ago and she is a wonderful presenter—clear, concise, and logical. She stresses two-way communication between horse and rider, using the lightest aides possible.

Vote for your participating delegates by June 30th! USDF is a

grassroots organization and these individuals will represent you on decisions made at the next USDF convention. This is your chance to participate, so vote for your delegate. We will have many educational sessions as well as the council and committee meetings, and of course, the Board of Governors assembly. I hope to see many of you at the convention since it is in our region.

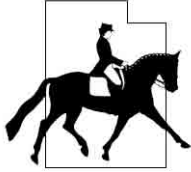

Question for the Editor

Why do I need to register my horse/rider pair every year to be eligible for UDS year end awards?

The horse and rider registration system is a method devised by the UDS to track our competitors and correctly record their scores. Think of how many human hands (many of them volunteers) these scores pass through before the final tally! There are opportunities for error at each step. The following are seven reasons to submit your horse and rider registration:

Current contact information

enables the awards tabulator to contact you to confirm scores, clarify discrepancies, and inform you of awards to be presented at the year end banquet.

The awards tabulator must know who owns the horse. Both rider and owner must be UDS members in order for a rider to receive a UDS year end award.

Different horses have similar or identical names. Information provided in the horse/rider registration form allows the awards tabulator to tell them apart.

Multiple riders on the same horse provides further opportunity for confusion. Receipt of a horse and

rider form from each rider clarifies that, indeed, show management has correctly reported scores from multiple riders on the same horse.

Providing the horses USDF number allows the awards tabulator to cross check scores against the USDF records. Missing or incorrect scores can be quickly corrected in this way.

Making the awards tabulator's duties less labor intensive prevents errors, allows seamless correction of errors, and gets the year end results out sooner.

It is the only way to get a year end award from the UDS!

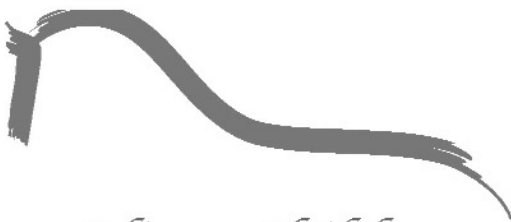

Jodpurs for Show Season 2009?

The question came up recently whether it would be okay for adults to wear jodpurs in a show. Jan Lawrence looked in the USEF rules and couldn't see anyplace that the use of them was limited to kids.

Since tall boots are expensive and sometimes hard to fit, this might be a less expensive alternative for a few riders who are just starting their show careers. Jan put the question to Veronica Holt, TD. Veronica refers us to a new USEF show dress rule to take effect for the 2009 show season.

DR120 Dress. [Chapter DR. Dressage Division] Effective 12/1/08:

The dress code for Training through Fourth Levels is a short riding coat of

conservative color, with tie, choker or stock tie, white or light-colored breeches or

jodhpurs, boots or jodhpur boots, a hunt cap or riding hat with a hard shell, derby or

top hat. A cutaway coat (modified tailcoat) with short tails is permitted. Half chaps,

gaiters and/or leggings are not allowed. Gloves of conservative color are

recommended. *Exception: Riders through First Level may wear half-chaps,*

gaiters or leggings in solid black or brown, without fringe, matching the color of

their boots, and made of smooth leather or leather-like material.

Designing a Ration for Your Horse

Some of us board our horses in equine facilities which are managed by people with years of experience designing rations for different types of horses. I am one of those with the luxury of putting the feed management of my horse in the capable hands of her caregivers. A change in her weight is always noticed and her feed adjusted accordingly. But many people keep their horses at home in order to enjoy the convenience of easy access to the barn not to mention the joy of mucking stalls. In this case, designing and managing equine rations falls on the horse owner. Some feed companies will design a diet for a specific horse. However, if you want to do it yourself or educate yourself before having it done by a company, here are some things to consider.

Nutritional requirements are a function of maintenance needs which are then adjusted based on the horse's activity.

Maintenance requirements are determined by body weight, environment, and digestive and metabolic activity. The latter may vary between horses more than you realize because, unlike livestock used for food production, horses have not been bred for feed efficiency.

The main dietary components to consider are energy, protein, minerals, and vitamins. Keep in mind that for some of these components, too much can be just as harmful as a deficiency. Also, the relative amounts of some nutrients are at least as important as absolute amounts.

For example, it is as important to balance the ratio of calcium and phosphorus as it is to give adequate amounts of either. In addition to maintenance needs, the current activity of the horse should be considered. This includes such activities as reproduction, growth, and work load. A good source of information for designing a horse ration is a publication by the Virginia Cooperative Extension which can be found at the following web site:

www.ext.vt.edu/pubs/horse/406-473/406-473.html. Physical

descriptions are also given to help you determine when the diet needs to be adjusted and in what way. The Merck Veterinary Manual is also a useful source and can be viewed on-line at www.merckvet-manual.com/mvm/index.jsp.

Fairy Godmother:

You need to fill out your entry as completely as possible every time. If membership numbers for you or your horse are not provided, you may not get credit for your rides with USDF or USEF. Please take the time to use the USEF Master Verification, available on the USEF website top toolbar under "Verification". This prints all numbers and memberships on ONE PAGE! It saves time and hassle and most of all, you will be credited for your rides. If all of your numbers are current, you could even print off extra copies for use with future shows! Look for it at www.usef.org.

Why I Have Decided to Become a Concert Pianist Instead of a Dressage Queen

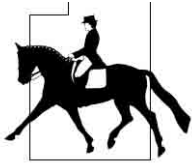
