

The Fine Print

To be signed and included with entry form.

The undersigned acknowledges there are inherent risks associated with equine activities such as described below, hereby expressly assumes all risks associated with participating in such activities. User acknowledges that horses, by their very nature, are unpredictable and subject to animal whim. User assumes all risks in connection therewith, and expressly waives any claims for injury or loss arising therefrom. User agrees to abide by and follow Manager's rules and regulations which shall be posted and/or available from time to time. User further acknowledges that the behavior of any animal is contingent to some extent upon the ability of the user. User assumes all risks therefore and warrants a full and fair disclosure of Rider's abilities has been made to Manager.

User expressly releases Management from any and all claims for personal injury or property damage, even if caused by negligence (if allowed by the laws of this State) by Management or its representatives, agents or employees. User agrees to assume any and all risks involved in or arising out of User's use of any equipment or livestock pertaining to the rental of horses or taking of riding lessons, the use of any arena on the premises of Management and for purposes of taking riding lessons either on the premises or lessons given off the premises by Management personnel.

User (or User's Parent or Guardian if user is a minor) agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend Management against any and all claims, demands, causes of action, damages, judgments, orders, costs or expenses, including Attorney's fees, which may in any way arise from or in any way be connected with user's use of or presence upon the property of Management and the facilities located thereon. In the event the User is a minor, the parent or guardian shall further indemnify, defend and hold Management harmless from any such claims by said minor child.

In the event User is using User's own horse, a horse not owned by Management, User warrants said horse shall be free from infection, contagious or transmittable diseases. Management reserves the right to refuse access or use of any horse upon the premises that does not appear to Management in good health, or is deemed dangerous or undesirable.

Any action brought under this agreement shall be brought within one(1) year of the incident or accident giving rise to said claim. User agrees damages shall be limited to \$250 for property damage, actual expenses incurred, and a maximum of \$10,000 for non-consequential damages such as pain and suffering.

Warning: Under Utah Law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or death of a participant engaged in an equine activity resulting from inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. 78-27b-102(2001).

The Facts

1. Thanks to Ryon and Holly Gardner for donating the use of Lava Bluffs Equestrian Center. Arena fees will be used to purchase High Point prizes.
2. Dress is "clinic casual"-clean tack, clean horse, clean boots, braids not required though appreciated, coats/whites not required, polo wraps or boots allowed.
3. Riders under the age of 18 must wear an approved helmet.
4. Arena is 20x60 meters, the standard dressage arena size. The gate will not be closed. Riders may enter the ring as soon as the previous rider makes her final salute, and do not need to leave the ring before riding up centerline.
5. All USEF rules regarding tack apply, with the exception of the western tack allowed by Cowboy riders. No martingales allowed in the show ring, make sure your whip is not too long, make sure you have the right kind of spurs and that they are on correctly, make sure you have a legal bit, single direct side reins only during lunging, single lunge line, in hand work not allowed, etc.
6. Warm up: 150' fenced round pen; 150'x300' fenced roping arena; unfenced 80'x150' arena above dressage ring. Lunging allowed only in fenced arenas or in the 35' round pen. Do not lunge in open areas.
7. Trailer parking by the roping arena.
8. On site porta-potty.
9. Snack table-riders show your number for a snack and drink.
10. Judges are currently enrolled as Participants in the United States Dressage Federation "L" Program, being trained in all facets of judging as expected at a Nationally recognized show.
11. Very limited overnight stabling. Contact show manager early. \$15/night.
12. Dogs are best left home. If you must bring them, they must be ON LEASH, and attached to a human being. Running around with the leash dragging behind does not count. Unattended tethered animals pose a significant risk to horses and riders and are not allowed.

Definition of Divisions

ADULT AMATEUR: 22 years and older. Must have an amateur declaration on file with USEF, and/or not received remuneration in any form for equine professional services in the past two years. This does not include fees for stud services or boarding fees. This does include lessons given at any level, horse training, horse handling, etc.

VINTAGE: Any Adult Amateur over the age of 50.

OPEN: Any rider may enter this division. Equine professionals must enter this division.

JR/YR: Any young person under the age of 22 who does not receive remuneration in any form for equine professional services.

COWBOY: Any rider who wishes to ride in western tack and attire. The bridle may have a simple snaffle bit only, no curbs, wires, or shanks. Rider must use two hands. Riders may use an English bridle and bit.

PRIZES WILL BE AWARDED TO THE HIGH POINT RIDER IN EACH DIVISION.

Directions: Take Highway 18(AKA Bluff Street) north from St. George, towards Enterprise. Take The Ledges Exit. Make the first right from the roundabout onto a gravel road. Follow the gravel road south, then east just over 1 mile. Take the left fork at the end of the road. Trailers coming in for the day, please park immediately along the west end of the roping arena, near the blue chute.
