

Utah Dressage Society Shows I and II

FEES:

- \$40 per class.
- \$45 per class for FEI and Musical Freestyle
- \$10 Great American Insurance Group/USDF qualifying class fee.
- \$30 per entry/per day office fee (non-refundable).
- \$15 USEF Drug and Medication fee.
- \$15 grounds/facility fee per day per horse. Does not apply if stabling.
- \$10 late/change fee per horse.
- \$25 USDF non-member fee.
- \$30 USEF non-member fee.
- \$25 returned check charge.
- \$10 class change

ENTRIES: Complete entries will be accepted first come-first served, based on postmark or online payment date. Entries are considered complete when a correct entry form, copies of membership cards and all fees are received. No hand delivery of entries. Post entries will only be accepted if time slots are available and not after 7:30 a.m. the day of the show. The show may be closed at 60 riders per day/per judge. Requests for class changes must be e-mailed to the show secretary. On show days, riders who scratch must notify the show secretary no later than 30 minutes before the scheduled time - failure to do so will be considered a "no-show" and subsequent rides may be forfeited. On competition days, empty ride times will be filled from a waiting list. Out-of-state competitors must provide a current negative Coggins and health certificate. Freestyle entries must include a copy of the qualifying test. Numbers will not be given to competitors until their entry is complete. Make checks to: Utah Dressage Society. REFUNDS: NO REFUNDS after the closing date or on competition days. \$30 Office fee is non-refundable. Drug, qualifying fees and facility fees will be refunded prior to closing date. If wait listed entries cannot be accepted because of a full show, all fees will be refunded. Refunds will NOT be given for class cancellation due to severe weather, accident or other emergency. Refunds by check will be postmarked no later than 30 days after the completion of show.

SPECIAL CLASSES: Second Level Test 3 offers a Dover Medal (DM) prize to the highest score of 58% or above. Materiale F/M is for 3, 4 and 5 year old fillies and mares. Materiale G/S is for 3, 4 and 5 year old geldings and stallions (see USEF DR133 and DR204.2e). Opportunity Training Level Test 1 and Opportunity Training Level Test 2 are classes made available for entry level riders who are experimenting with dressage showing (see USEF GR821). Opportunity riders are not required to hold a USEF or a USDF membership, nor required to pay the nonmember fees. Riders entering Opportunity classes may not cross enter into the rated/recognized classes but they may enter the Intro A, B, or C class which are not rated/recognized.

PONY MEASURING: If a pony is not in possession of a fully and correctly completed Measurement Certificate, the pony must be measured by the show TD and the show veterinarian. The pony owner is responsible for all veterinarian fees associated with the pony measurement. Please contact the show manager to arrange for an appointment for measurement. (USEF DR134). Veterinarian will be available from 9am - 5 pm.

TIMES & UPDATES: Provisional ride times will be posted on the web at www.utahdressagesociety.org or e-mail the show secretary at Piaffthis@gmail.com after August 9. It is the competitor's responsibility to confirm ride times on the day of the show. The show committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split classes, to change arenas, to refuse any entry and to limit the number of rides per rider to facilitate scheduling.

AWARDS: Ribbons first place through sixth place. Prizes to high percentage: Amateur, Open and Jr/YR of each level each day. In the

event of a tie, the total of the collective marks will determine the placing. If the tie remains and prizes are given, show management will break the tie with a coin toss for the prize. Prize money, if offered, will be awarded at the show or within 30 days of the competition.

STABLING: Limited stabling, mostly indoor, is available on the grounds at \$40 per day. You provide your own feed and clean the stall. Full stall shavings on day one and thereafter as needed. Stalls are at least 12 x 12 with full doors. Submit a completed stabling form with your show entry. First come first serve. You may not request stabling until your entry form has been received by US mail. No tack stalls will be available. Horse riders/owners must provide emergency contact information for all horses stabled on site. Contact Susan Jero for stabling questions 801-330-5763.

SHOW/WARM-UP ARENAS: 2-20x60 m. arenas with dirt/sand footing with permanent judges booths. One 70x70 m. warm up outdoor with dirt/sand footing, and one 30x70 m. indoor warm up arena. Hand walking around the show arenas during the competition will only be permitted before and after the show. Lunging will be allowed in a designated area ONLY. Only horses with numbers will be permitted on the show grounds. Numbers are required at all times when the horse is out of its stall. Schooling is available the day before the show 12:00 noon to 8:00 pm. Contact Jan Lawrence for additional arena schooling time. Riders and horses have the right of way always.

SAFETY COORDINATOR: On grounds during competition.

HELMET POLICY: Riders under 18 and riders riding Intro - IV must wear helmets when mounted. Please review new 20110 UDS helmet policy on UDS internet site.

FOOD: Continental breakfast and lunch available for a fee.

MISC: NO DOGS PLEASE! Dogs will be asked to go back to their homes.

MEDICAL: Medical personnel on grounds during competition.

VETERINARIAN AND FARRIER: On-call. Phone numbers available in the show office. Sharps containers in the show office and in the barn.

HOTELS: The nearest hotels are 20-30 minutes away. UDS Group Rates of \$79/night at Hampton Inn, Thanksgiving Point, Lehi (801)766-1186; be sure to mention UDS. Other options include: Days Inn Lehi (801)768-8322, Super 8 Motel Lehi (801)766-8800, Best Western Timpanogos Inn Lehi, (801)768-1400, , and Springhill Suites Thanksgiving Point Lehi (801)341-6970. Both fast food and dine-in restaurants are within walking distance of all hotels listed here. Food will also be available on site during the show.

CAMPING: Allowed on site with very limited hookups. No fee.

DIRECTIONS: Because of Fairfield's remote and unique location, do not rely on GPS. **From north of Draper, Utah:** I-15 South to Bangert Highway exit 289 and turn west. At Redwood Rd. turn south and drive 8.1 miles to UT-73, turn right. Drive 17 miles to Fairfield. You will now be driving south; look for the sign for Camp Floyd State Historical Site, turn left onto 1540 North. Continue driving east 1 mile until you see the sign "Vernon Utah Livestock, and then turn right. Follow the paved road which will turn to the left and you'll see the dressage rings and the large indoor arena on your left. Turn left onto the show grounds from the cul de sac at the end of the paved road. **From south of Draper, Utah:** Take I-15 north to exit 279. Turn left (west) under the freeway onto SR-73. Go west on SR-73 through Lehi towards Saratoga Springs for several miles. You will have to negotiate a roundabout part way through Lehi. Keep going west past the roundabout. You will remain on SR-73 all the way to Fairfield. Once you cross the Jordan River and start up a gradual incline you are approaching Saratoga Springs. You will come upon a shopping area. There is a major intersection with SR-68 and from this intersection continue on SR-73 17 miles to Fairfield. You will now be driving south. look for the sign for Camp Floyd State Historical Site, turn left onto 1540 North. Continue driving east 1 mile until you see the sign "Vernon Utah Livestock, and turn right. Follow the paved road which will turn to the left and you'll see the dressage rings and the large indoor arena on your left. Turn left onto the show grounds from the cul de sac at the end of the paved road.
